About us

The AMA Association is a non-profit, non-governmental organization, legally constituted in 2016, which promotes the comprehensive development of adolescent girls, women and indigenous and mestizo youth, through programs aimed at transferring capacities and strengthening leadership attitudes, democratic participation and sustainable economic development, with emphasis on the promotion and defense of sexual and reproductive rights of adolescent girls, women and young people in the department of Petén, Guatemala.

We are a non-profit organization that promotes and encourages leadership, democratic participation, access to comprehensive sexuality education, sexual and adolescent girls, women, and youth in the department of peten

Vision

To be a leading and recognized organization that promotes the comprehensive development of women and youth, through programs aimed at transferring skills and strengthening attitudes of leadership, democratic participation and defense of human rights and sexual and reproductive rights of adolescent girls, women and youth in the department of Petén











During the year 2020, due to the emergency caused by COVID-19, the Government of the Republic of Guatemala decreed a State of Calamity, within which the suspension of classes was established at all educational levels, suspension of work in the public sector and private, closure of some shops, prohibition of public transport circulation and curfew. The activities of Asociación AMA were reformulated, adapting them to the situation to continue promoting actions aimed at responding to the high rates of pregnancies, sexual violence, marriages and child, early and forced unions in adolescent girls and young women in Guatemala, mainly in the department from Peten.

Activities and scope

Dialogue and Advocacy







21,600 adolescent girls and women from rural communities and marginal urban areas Maya Q'eqchí and Mestizas from 5 departments of Guatemala (Petén, Izabal, Quiche, Alta and Baja Verapaz, Guatemala), who tune in to the community radio stations U'tan Kaj and Shekina, They received timely information on ways to contain COVID-19, the importance of adolescent girls returning to their studies, violence prevention, the importance of access to sexual and reproductive health in times of pandemic, and government regulations related to the pandemic.

They also began to carry out transmissions through Facebook Live on the AMA Association FanPage, which allowed innovation in the ways in which capacities are transferred and advocacy is carried out.

40 leaders and delegated leaders of the different institutions and governmental and non-governmental organizations of the Southern Petén area together with the AMA Association joined forces to comprehensive response, attached to the reality of the surviving victims of crime and to follow up on the 2020 Strategic Plan.

A cooperation agreement was signed with the Public Ministry of Poptún, Petén, which allowed strengthening the development of Network meetings and leadershipwho LOVES to initiate to have in it.







ACTIVITIES

Meetings of the Petén Departmental "Prevent with Education" Technical Board, which had the objective of resuming and rearranging the actions of the strategic plan. This greatly strengthened the continuity of the political advocacy processes promoted by the AMA Association.

Meeting with the Departmental Governor of Petén to agree on actions in conjunction with the different ministries and institutions to reduce the rates of pregnancy in adolescent girls and that in this way they can have a better future.

> Through the Technical Committee "Prevent with Education" in the department of Petén, the National Pregnancy Prevention Plan -PLANEA- was presented to the Governor of the Department of Petén.











Covid-19 Educational and Information Campaign

65,000 people from rural communities and urban the marginal areas of municipalities of the department of Petén were informed through bilingual educational posters on COVID-19 hygiene standards, taking into account the Maya Q'eqchi' mother tongue, their customs and traditions for an effective response.





3,000 Maya Q'egchi' and Mestiza adolescent girls and young women from the municipalities of San Luis, Poptún, Dolores, El Chal and Santa Ana, Petén, were informed through billboards about the prevention of violence against women in times of pandemic and telephone numbers to denounce as well as hygiene measures of COVID-19 in Poptún, Petén, this because the municipality of Poptún is the center of convergence of the South of Petén.

In addition, 12,000 Maya Q'eqchi' and Mestiza people from the municipalities of San Luis, Poptún, Dolores, El Chal and Santa Ana, Petén were informed about the prevention of violence against women in times of pandemic through












350 collaborators of the Petén Sur Oriente Health Area Directorate and the Poptún District Hospital, Petén, Guatemala received masks as part of the COVID-19 prevention measures.











A strategic alliance was achieved with government institutions for the placement of posters: the Petén Sur Oriente Health Area Directorate, the Petén Norte Directorate, Municipal Women's Offices and the Petén Ministry of Agriculture

ACTIVITIES

Printing and placement of 13,000 posters with illustrated bilingual Spanish-Maya Q'eqchi' information on COVID-19 prevention and hygiene norms, in points of affluence such as schools, neighborhood stores, refreshment stores, tortilla shops, among others.

> Placement of 4 billboards with information on violence prevention in times of pandemic and COVID-19 hygiene measures in Poptún, Peten.

Training and qualification

25 Pedagogical and Administrative Advisors of the Educational Supervisions of the municipalities of the department of Petén prioritized in the PLANEA were strengthened on how to use the virtual platforms to organize and facilitate dynamic online sessions to continue the Comprehensive Education in Sexuality diplomas.









250 collaborators from the Petén Norte and Petén Sur Oriente Health Areas who strengthened their capacities on comprehensive and differentiated care, which strengthens access to care and timely information for 5,400 adolescents and young people on reproductive sexual and health, pregnancy prevention, and sexual violence, who visit health services.

ACTIVITIES

Four online workshops were facilitated with 25 pedagogical and administrative advisors from Southern Petén: Basic tips for online facilitation, how to facilitate online effectively, how to facilitate online team meetings and how to design dynamic online spaces.

Humanitarian Assistance

600 adolescent girls and young women received bags of food as a response to immediate needs such as the supply of basic food baskets to reduce the negative effects on the economy caused by COVID-19 and the ETA and IOTA storms and to strengthen food and nutrition security.





600 adolescent girls and young women received a hygiene kit that strengthened menstrual hygiene and the prevention of COVID-19, since each kit contained: 3 Packages of sanitary towels, 1 Package of toilet paper, 3 scented soaps, 1 bottle of gel alcohol, 1 bottle of antibacterial liquid soap, 1 bottle of chlorine and 1 mask.

ACTIVITIES

Delivery of 600 bags of groceries and 600 bags of hygiene kits to participants of Asociación AMA's programs:

-175 adolescent girls from 8 elementary schools in southern Petén.

-100 young women members of the teams that participate in the women's soccer championships promoted by AMA.

-325 adolescent girls from 3 primary schools in Poptún, Petén.
